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J Brabant videoed the meeting. Discussion included, WEC service area is mostly all residential, no major

commercial, Harwood Union is biggest building. Has a goal of 100% renewable. The grid is bi directional but was supposed to be hub and spoke, therefore we have an balance, and SHEI is a problem. Further south (in Vermont) you located PV the less constraints you have. WEC has some "head room" in some of our towns (with in the transformers.) WEC doesn't need any more solar. Hopes change in SHEI will change the planning landscape. Referenced a recently released report (DG Report) which will be reviewed by the legislature.

GMP solar maps are showing preferred site for solar from the perspective from the electric engineer. Discussion about energy transformation by transiting transportation to electric with electric batteries. Good opportunity for fixed route busses. Funding Opportunities to help with Energy Transformation

Northfield City Electric is an Investor type utility. Don't have a lot of space for solar, does have a brownfield site which could host.

The topic of preferred sites was raised and the question is "Preferred" according to whom? The planner, the utilities, the neighbor the town, the rate payer, the electrical engineer. A gravel pit near 3 phase power good site, as it's an open site with good aspect but if it's located at the end of the line, it's not a great site. Communities should be thinking about resilience so put small projects near small loads. Put the generation near the need, larger generation near large populations. And put the energy storage also near the need. Don't site at "the end of the road." Waninger suggested a process to evaluate a preferred site which has been discussed by the Regional Plan Committee. There was agreement from the utilities this is a decent approach. J Brabant asked if we could get a contact at the utilities so we could run a project by the utility for their perspective. Presenters were willing to be a point of connect.
