EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- 3 B. Waninger reported that Municipal Planning Grants were announced and the CVRPC is talking
- 4 with municipalities regarding Local Hazard Mitigation Plans and energy planning in an effort to
- 5 start setting the FY18 work plan. Discussion also included information regarding a memo that
- 6 was included in the agenda from the Vermont Association of Planning & Development Agencies
- 7 (VAPDA) regarding comments on revenue options for water quality funding.

CENTRAL VERMONT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION REPORT

- No report was provided. B. Waninger noted that J. Stewart would be providing quarterly updates to the Commission instead of monthly reports
- 11 to the Commission instead of monthly reports.

ACT 250 AGRICULTURAL LANDS MITIGATION MAPPING PROJECT

- 14 L. Masseria and S. Smith from the Agency of Agriculture provided an overview of a mapping
- project that has been on-going within the agency to map lands that have been mitigated through
- the Act 250 process. The presentation included an overview of the Agency of Agriculture's role
- in the Act 250 process with L. Masseria noting the agency primarily deals with Criterion 9b
- which addresses prime agricultural soils. The presentation included information regarding on-
- site and off-site mitigations noting that off-site mitigations typically involved a fee to the
- Vermont Housing Conservation Board for funds to be used to conserve active farms.

- 22 It was noted that the mapping project began in 2015 and was for Chittenden County only. The
- 23 2016 project included the rest of the state and has been completed. L. Masseria noted that the
- 24 project included applications from 2006 to the present. It was noted that many of the records do
- 25 not exist or are not detailed enough to determine what lands were mitigated on-site prior to 2006.
- 26 It was noted that there are 111 on-site mitigation areas that total approximately 1,400 acres of
- 27 land with District 5 (which includes the CVRPC) having the second most land with on-site
- 28 mitigation in the state.

- 30 L. Masseria outlined the goals of the project and discussed next steps. Members of the
- 31 Commission engaged in discussion including questions regarding the program including
- 32 enforcement and how off-site mitigation has been used. This item was included for information
- and did not require action.

REGIONAL ENERGY PLANNING

- 36 E. Vorwald provided an overview of the rules of procedure for the Regional Energy Committee
- 37 noting that the committee met and discussed the document. E. Vorwald noted one correction
- 38 related to the date of Act 174. G. Malek made a motion to approve the rules of procedure with
- 39 the correction to the date as noted. B. Fitzgerald seconded the motion.

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- 1 Discussion included questions about why the committee was exempt from following the
- 2 Commission's bylaws. This discussion continued involving multiple members of the
- 3 Commission and staff. The question was called for and vote was taken on the motion. The
- 4 Commission voted unanimously to approve the rules of procedure for the Regional Energy
- 5 Committee including the change in date for Act 174.
- 6 D. Currier provided the Commission with an overview of the mapping requirements for the
- 7 regional energy plan including known constraints, possible constraints, and the differences
- 8 between the two. D. Currier also discussed additional constraints that were specific to the region
- 9 that should be considered including steep slopes, elevation limits, municipal lands, lakeshore
- protection, and properties in Current Use program.

- 12 Discussion continued regarding the purpose of the maps and deadlines for information. D.
- 13 Currier asked the Commission to identify areas that they felt were appropriate for renewable
- energy siting as well as any additional constraints that should be included in the mapping. D.
- 15 Currier noted that a deliverable of maps was due December 15, 2016, however edits would be
- made after that date to address specific issues or concerns. Commissioners were generally in
- 17 favor of adding the specific constraints as noted in the presentation. This item was for
- 18 information and did not require official action.

RESOLUTION REGARDING REGULAR MEETING DATES

- 21 B. Waninger noted that a resolution was included with the regular meeting dates and times of
- committees of the Commission. The resolution is required as per open meeting laws. G. Malek
- made a motion to approve the resolution as presented. D. La Haye seconded the motion. S.
- 24 Lotspeich noted that the Transportation Advisory Committee discussed changing their starting
- 25 time to 6:30pm. The motion was amended to reflect this change. With no other comments, the
- 26 Commission voted unanimously to approve the resolution with the change in time for the
- 27 Transportation Advisory Committee.

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ADJOURNMENT

- 31 B. Wernecke moved to adjourn the meeting which was seconded by G. Malek. The Commission
- voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting. With no other business the meeting was adjourned at
- 33 8:50pm.
