Rather, it suggested a meeting between ANR, RPC, and NRCD staff to negotiate services. Asking contractors to negotiate with one another for independent work is highly unusual. In general, the decision will change how planning services are provided and how/whether local planning is intergrated into the State's Basin Plans.

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In addition to changing the services provided to municipalities, the decision means CVRPC may have a \$6-15,000 budget gap. The gap can be filled by reducing contributions to reserves, by increasing other revenues during the year, or by modifying expenses.
