Approve May, 28th TAC Minutes:

S. Lotspeich suggested some corrections to the minutes. R. Wernecke motioned to accept the May 28th TAC minutes as corrected. R. Krauth seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Plainfield US2/Main St Intersection Reconstruction Update

- 22 Erin Parizo of VTrans and Gregory Goyette of Stantec presented on the work done to develop a
- 23 preferred alternative for the Plainfield US2/Main St Intersection. This intersection has received
- 24 new momentum and community engagement so that a preferred alternative has been
- designed. The scoping work was conducted back in 2005 by CVRPC, at that time the community
- 26 did not select a preferred alternative. The project was then restarted 2014 with VTrans

- 1 studying the intersection, with the assistance of Stantec. The intersection has a lot of
- 2 constraints to deal with including: properties, grade, traffic, pedestrian, and cost. The
- 3 intersection geometry is also very awkward with poor sight distance, steep grades, high
- 4 volumes, and historic structures. So the room is very limited to do anything.

5

- 6 VTrans with help from CVRPC and the Town came to a consensus on a preferred alternative.
- 7 This alternatives being a three way signalized T intersection. The design will remove the island
- and utility poll, build new sidewalks and cut US 2 down by 2 feet. The new grade for Main St
- 9 will be changed from 16% to 15%. The grade of 15% is above the highway specification for side
- roads. 10% is the standard, but there will be a 5% stop area for the first car to sit on.

11

- 12 Q1 Will the old Plainfield hardware store be removed? No it will stay but conversation will be
- 13 had with all of the landowners.
- 14 Q2 What will happen with the removal of the parking spaces in front of the old store? VTrans
- and the towns are looking for a way to mitigate the loss of parking perhaps on the adjacent
- 16 town parking.
- 17 Q3 Do you have the profiles? Not at the meeting but Greg will share.
- 18 Q4 What about the cross walk and the grade? They will be installed to the ada compliant and
- 19 the signal will have a dedicated ped crossing. More work on the design and local preference
- will be incorporated as they work out the details and design.
- 21 Q5 How different is the grade from the previous preferred to this one? It is the same?
- 22 Addition design considerations
- 23 Q6 How can construction occur? Main st would be closed temporarily with alternating 1 way
- traffic on us 2.
- 25 Q7 How long will the constitution take? One constitution season

- 27 The timeline for this project is as follows. Public information meeting will take place with the
- town is a few months, fall 2019 30% plan update, winter 2020 60% plans, ROW started 2020,
- 29 100% with bid advertisement-TBD, with possible construction in 2023. Public engagement will
- 30 be important and VTrans plans to start it very soon?

- 32 Q8 Have you considered underground the utilities? Those conversations have started but the
- 33 utility don't like to pay for it. So there is more to work out.
- 34 Q9 Could the railing be fixed to help improve sign distance? We have really focused on the
- 35 final solution and not spent to much time on other fixes.

Berlin Route 62/Paine Turnpike Park and Ride Discussion

- 1 D. Currier present the preferred alternative for the Berlin Exit 7 Park and Ride expansion. In
- 2 total the park and ride will be expanded from 76 spots to 112 with 5 handicap, a new bus
- 3 shelter, lighting, and an exit directly onto VT 62. The land around the new park and ride will
- 4 have a berm installed with trees to help shield the adjacent land owner's view of the park and
- 5 ride. Robert Clark (adjacent land owner) talk about his experience working with VTrans on this
- 6 project including being proactive about talking with VTrans and advocating for the
- 7 improvements that would lest impact his quality of life. He also talk about using his local and
- 8 state contacts to make sure he was heard. The TAC discussed further with R. Clark about the
- 9 park and ride.

10

- 11 Q1 Why is this expansion of the park and ride occurring? The park and ride use at this lot has 12 been over VTrans's thresholders and was identified for expanding in their 2016 Park and Ride
- 13 Plan.

- 22 Task 1 Program Administration: This task covers the administration of work program and
- 23 budget.
- 24 Task 2 Public Participation and Coordination: This task covers the time spent by staff
- attending public meetings, including the TAC meetings, and working with VTrans on various
- 26 State working groups.
- 27 Task 3 Long Range Planning: This task covers the time spent by staff to assist Green Mountain
- 28 Transit and updated our local and regional plans.
- 29 Task 4 Short Range Planning: This task covers the time spent by staff to conduct our field
- 30 services including culvert and bridge inventors, vehicle counts, and road erosion inventors.
- 31 There is a new task included in short Range Planning: Public Transit Planning Human Services
- 32 Transportation Coordination/Regional E&D (Elderly and Disabled) Public Transit Advisory
- 33 Committees (RPTAC)
- 34 Task 5 Project Development Planning: This task covers the time spent by staff to assist with
- 35 grant and project development.
- Task 6 Other Planning Activities This is a new task that includes (Watershed Planning):
 - Transportation System Resiliency Planning work includes add the Stevens Branch watershed to the tool and assist the communities in incorporating the results into
- 39 their local planning documents.
