Vermont Department of Health

Pop-Up Testing

Eleven sites are currently scheduled to collect specimens from asymptomatic Vermonters, health care workers, first responders (EMS, fire, and law enforcement), child care providers currently serving essential workers, and people returning to Vermont – such as college students, people who winter out of state and second home owners. The sites are led by Health Department teams, with support from EMS units and members of the Vermont National Guard.

Vermonters with <u>symptoms</u> – no matter how mild – should contact their health care provider to get referred to a nearby testing site.

People who do not have a health care provider can call 2-1-1 to be connected with a local <u>community</u> <u>or hospital-connected clinic</u> for referral to a test site.

Agency of Commerce and Community Development

"Be Smart, Stay Safe"

On May 15, the Governor extended the State of Emergency through June 15, 2020. Additionally he released "Be Smart, Be Safe" executive order as an update to the Stay Home, Stay Safe order from March 24. Additional guidance is expected to follow soon.

ACCD Authorized for Phased Reopening

On May 14, Governor Scott issued an Amendment to Addendum 6 to Executive Order 01-20. This enables the ACCD Secretary to authorize limited, incremental and phased resumption of non-essential business, non-profit, and government operations, in consultation with the VDH and the approval of the Governor. New Guidance for Lodging Operations

ACCD issued guidance to the lodging and hospitality industry that all lodging properties must remain closed, and should cancel reservations booked between May 15 and May 22. Effective May 22, the Governor may authorize modified lodging operations. Read the email sent to lodging establishments here.

New Retail Guidance

ACCD released updated guidance for reopening of non-essential retail and drive in operations. This guidance goes into effect on May 18. Additions include:

- Non-essential retail operations are limited to 25% occupancy; or 1 customer per 200 square feet; or 10 total customers and staff (whichever is greater).
- Cashless/touch-less transactions are strongly preferred
- Curbside pickup remains preferred method of operation
