Agency of Commerce and Community Development

Addendum 16 and updated ACCD guidance for Close Contact Businesses and Overnight Summer Camps

Addendum 16, signed by Governor Scott on May 29, allows:

- Social gatherings of 25 people or less
- Close contact businesses can open June 1 with capacity limits and health and safety precautions (updated ACCD guidance here)
- Overnight summer camps can operate in accordance with VDH and ACCD guidance (updated ACCD guidance <u>here</u>)

Restart Plan Templates

Restart plan templates are <u>now available</u> for <u>construction</u>; <u>golf courses</u>; <u>gyms and fitness centers</u>; <u>manufacturing</u>, <u>distribution and warehousing</u>; <u>real estate sales and leasing</u>; <u>restaurants</u>; and <u>retail establishments</u>. These plans can help businesses establish best practices as they reopen and train employees on safety precautions and protocols.

June 5: Virtual Town Hall on Paycheck Protection Program

The Department of Economic Development will host a <u>virtual town hall</u> to share updates about the Paycheck Protection Program. Funds are still available for businesses to access. Representatives from the SBA and local banks and credit unions will be available to answer questions.
