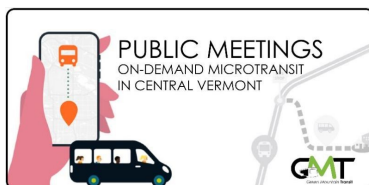
Challenges to Sustainable Transportation in Vermont

Eastern Old Growth Forests: What They Are, Why They're Important, and Opportunities for Management

October 12, 2020 | 7:00-8:00 PM

Join Ethan Tapper, the Chittenden County Forester and CVU's Access program for a discussion of eastern old growth forests. Ethan will discuss what old growth forests are like (it may surprise you!), why they should be important to us, and what our role may be in helping develop new old growth on our landscape. In addition to allowing forests to grow and develop into old growth on their own, new research has highlighted opportunities to manage forests actively to become more like old growth forests sooner than they would naturally. Combined with an ecological forestry approach, this presents an opportunity to manage forests while increasing biodiversity, resiliency and overall health. 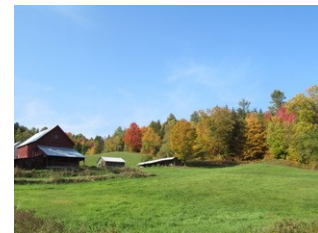

Join the City of Montpelier Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) Update Committee

The City of Montpelier, in collaboration with the Central Vermont Regional Planning Commission (CVRPC), is beginning the update process for Montpelier's local hazard mitigation plan (LHMP). We are looking for community leaders and partner organizations for their participation and support to build the LHMP Committee- which will be the core group responsible for making decisions, guiding the planning process, and agreeing on the contents of the plan. An effective LHMP Committee engages multiple City departments and stakeholders to ensure the plan incorporates information not just on emergency management and hazard mitigation, but also

land use, recreation, natural resources, public safety, housing, and utilities/facilities management. An ideal candidate for this committee will have experience in one of these topics.

We anticipate the plan update process will involve several meetings taking place over the next 5 to 6 months. If you are interested, please complete the Council Committee application (available online here: <https://www.montpelier-vt.org/CommitteeApplication>), no later than **October 8, 2020**.

COVID 19 Updates

LGER Application Deadline Extended to October 15th

The LGER deadline has been extended to October 15th for current non-applicants- eligible units of local government (ULGs) that have not submitted an LGER application. See below for additional instructions.

- **Current Non-Applicants:** the LGER application portal has been reopened to allow these ULGs to submit an application. The portal will close on October 15. Applications for current non-applicants must be submitted through the Tax Dept. website

(<https://tax.vermont.gov/coronavirus/municipal-grants/lger-grant>)

- **Applicants** (ULGs that have applied to LGER): can amend their existing applications by contacting the Tax Dept. Amendments to existing grant application **must** be sent to tax.munigrants@vermont.gov for tracking purposes and to avoid duplicate applications. The email should discuss what the applicant wishes to revise (ex. supplies) and provide information about the change (ex. increase the amount by \$XX). These applicants should not submit information through the website.

VTrans is now accepting grant applications for the SFY 2021 Transportation Alternatives Program. This year, Transportation Alternatives Program funding (roughly \$2.2 million) is available for all eligible activities as described in the Vermont Transportation Alternatives Fall 2020 Application Guide per the link below. Applications are due in-hand or by e-mail by Friday, November 27, 2020.
