## Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Antiracism Resources

NNECAPA's 2020 conference theme, *Vision Check: Lessons in Hindsight, Planning with Foresight*, included insightful conversation about what diversity, equity, inclusion, and antiracism really mean, and how to begin recognizing and championing this work as planners. ### **BIPOC Business Survey**


The <u>Vermont Partnership for Fairness and Diversity</u> has launched a survey to gauge interest in the creation of an entity to serve the needs of BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) business owners in Vermont. The entity would provide technical assistance to BIPOC business owners and assist in securing state and federal grants to support businesses in times of crisis. <u>The survey is open until November 15th</u>.

## **Telecommuting Survey Results Released**

The Center for Research on Vermont recently surveyed 662 Vermonters on their attitudes toward telecommuting and working from home. The survey attempted to capture Vermonter's impressions of telecommuting in the midst of the pandemic – the crisis presenting an enormous con-trolled experiment in Vermonters' experiences and perception of working from home. At the time of the survey, Google mobility reported a 42 percent drop in workplace travel and a 58 percent decline in retail shopping. Survey respondents overwhelming support telework, and strongly support being able to continue to work from home in the future.

Clearly, this population may have been more inclined to telework and their experience at this moment has only further emphasized their interest in doing so. More than half (55%) said they expect to work more from home after things return to something more like normal. And large pluralities said their workplace (70%) and internet service (86%) was good to excellent – enabling them to do so.

The biggest challenge identified by most respondents was the lack of workplace policies and support to allow them to telecommute more in the future. More than two-thirds said there was more their employers could do to enable them to work from home more often. The clearest recommendation that emerges is that there should be support and resources for small and large employers developing telework policies and programs. ## **Resilient Rights of Way Guide**

Resilient Right-of-Ways: A guide to community stewardship of Vermont backroads is the culmination of a collaborative approach to better understand and care for forests, individual trees, and other vegetation along Vermont backroads. Informed by 200 miles of rural roadside assessments and input from over 60 local volunteers and municipally focused professionals, this guide was developed by Urban and Community Forestry and provides information to support community priorities and plans of action for backroad vegetation.

## **Community Connect Grants**

The Community Connect grant program provides financial assistance to eligible applicants that will provide broadband service in rural, economically-challenged communities where service does not exist.

What is an eligible area?

Rural areas that lack any existing broadband speed of at least 10 Mbps downstream and 1 Mbps upstream are eligible.

Eligible applicants include:

- Incorporated organizations
- Federally-recognized Tribes
- State and local units of government
- Any other legal entity, including cooperatives, private corporations, or limited liability companies organized on a for-profit or not-for-profit basis

The Application Guide provides guidance on rural areas currently eligible for Community Connect Grants. Applications are due by December 23, 2020, 11:59 p.m. EST.
