#### Calais LHMP Survey- Feedback Requested

The Town of Calais is looking for help identifying local safety hazards to assist in editing the Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP).

Hazard Mitigation Plans aim to develop long-term strategies for protecting people and property from future hazard events. Hazard mitigation is the effort to reduce loss of life and property damage by lessening the impact of disasters. This is accomplished by identifying risks and vulnerabilities associated with natural and other disasters and developing long-term strategies for protecting people and property from future hazard events.

Hazard mitigation is most effective when implemented through a strategic, comprehensive, and long-term Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP), which are reviewed and updated every 5 years. The Town of Calais, in collaboration with the Central Vermont Regional Planning Commission, has begun the LHMP update process and is looking for input from Calais residents to help identify hazards that impact the Town.

## “Slow the Spread” Efforts Ongoing in Vermont Despite End to Federal Emerald Ash Borer Quarantine

On January 14<sup>th</sup>, the U.S. Department of Agriculture’s (USDA) Animal Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) ended the [Federal Emerald Ash Borer \(EAB\) quarantine](#) to place more emphasis on management and biological controls to combat the pest. In Vermont, while we continue to find new areas of infestation, our forests support overwhelmingly healthy populations of ash to protect as long as possible. ## COVID 19 Updates

### H48 Passes

In response to COVID-19 H48 has been signed by the Governor and includes in part:

- Authorizes municipalities to move the date of their 2021 annual meeting;
- Authorizes municipalities to mail out annual meeting Australian ballots to all active, registered municipal voters; and
- Authorizes the Secretary of State to order or permit supplemental elections procedures related to these 2021 annual municipal meeting provisions. More details [here](#).

## RFP's, Grant Information, Applications & Deadlines

### Microgrants Open to Vermont Artists

The Montpelier Public Art Commission has two microgrant programs available to Vermont-based artists. The award for the first of these will be up to \$1500 for a short-term installation (0 to 5 years) anywhere within the city with no limits on the medium, size, or style. The second, titled "Picture It Big," will award \$500 to artists for the right to enlarge a digital image (up to 20' x 10') that can be hung on a downtown building for up to two years. Images for this grant can be made by any method (photography, painting, digital program, etc.) and may be of any style but must fit within the theme of "We Are All In This Together." The commission will be responsible for the printing and hanging of the images. Submissions are [due March 12](#). ### New Grant Funds Available from the 1772 Foundation

In cooperation with the Preservation Trust of Vermont, the 1772 Foundation is pleased to announce that funding in the form of 1:1 matching grants of \$5,000 – 10,000 is available for the following historic preservation projects in Vermont:

- Exterior painting, finishes and surface restoration
- Installation or upgrading fire detection, lightning protection and security systems
- Repairs to/restoration of porches, roofs and windows
- Structural foundation and sill repair/replacement
- Chimney and masonry repointing

## EPA's 2021 DERA National Grant Program

EPA's Office of Transportation and Air Quality is soliciting applications nationwide for projects that achieve significant reductions in diesel emissions. Priority for funding is given to fleets operating in areas designated as having poor air quality and fleets which service goods movement facilities. Further priority for funding is given to projects with outcomes that benefit affected communities, those that engage affected communities in the design and performance of the project, and those which demonstrate the ability to promote and continue efforts to reduce emissions after the project has ended. Awards will be selected and managed by EPA's ten regional offices. EPA anticipates 2 to 8 cooperative agreement awards per EPA region, subject to the availability of funds, the quality of applications received, and other considerations.
