COVID 19 Updates

Updates to CDC and State Mask Guidance

Effective tomorrow, 5/1/21, masks will no longer be required outdoors, provided physical distancing can be maintained. This applies to both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals.

Vermont Moves to Step 2 of Vermont Forward Plan

Effective May 1ST, Vermont will move to Step 2 to the Vermont Forward Plan.

- Meetings of public bodies and town meetings are in the Group B sector and will move to Universal Guidance requirements (see here).
- Gathering and events: Indoor: 1 unvaccinated person per 100 sq. ft. up to 150 people, plus any # of vaccinated people; Outdoor: 300, plus any number of vaccinated people

Economic Recovery Bridge Grants Announced

On April 17, 2021, H.315 was enacted (Act 9). The Act appropriates \$10 million of funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) to ACCD to provide priority funding to businesses that have not received prior State or Federal financial assistance. To the extent that funds remain available, the program is also intended to provide funding to businesses that have suffered a tax loss even after receiving State or Federal aid. ACCD has published <u>public guidance</u>.
