Larry shared basically how neonics worked and a bit of the history of wondering about neonics in the environment. Neonics can enter soil and groundwater. It is a coating on the seed that is uptake on the plants. Impacts a bee's nervous system.

In dog flea treatment. Friends of the Earth reference in the article says that Vermont has banned for restricts the use of neonic and does not make them widely available.

We discussed how we get this information to the State to request more research? What is our action item? Bill passed in 2019. Should we still be concerned?

Ask DEC or AAFM if its still used at all in Vermont. We should also find out if it ubiquitous and still around?

H.439 FY22 APPROPRIATIONS ACT AND ARPA CLEAN WATER FUNDS

Pam shared the most recent discussion of the Clean Water Board (CWB) regarding Clean Water Funding and H.439 and ARPA. 6% Meals and Rooms Tax (MRT) will be removed temporarily from CW funding and ARPA will add funds. The CWB may have to come up with other ways to fund some projects since the ARPA funds will be more infrastructure based and that there may be a gap in funding due to the ARPA funds needing to be spent by 2024. They will wait until the US Treasury guidance before redoing any budgets.

Joyce mentioned that they bill is not final yet as it needs to go to the Senate and then the Governor so things could change a lot. The legislature does not want any gaps to occur for funds. She also mentioned that the property transfer tax will replace MRT and that due to increased home ownership in Vermont from the COVID fall out, this may be higher than previous years.

CVRPC CLEAN WATER PROJECTS UPDATE

Pam shared project updates for the Central Vermont Region that are in the pipeline in Barre City, Berlin, Plainfield, Calais, East Montpelier, Woodbury, and Moretown. She shared her web map of stormwater projects from stormwater master plans and the stage they are at 30%, final design, or construction. By the end of this calendar year, many projects will be ready for funding for construction.

WDEV STATION PROGRAM

Ron shared that he heard a program on WDEV about watershed research and he heard them mention that people are not doing any research or planning. Ron wanted to have someone contact the radio station and let them know that watershed groups, RPCs, and the state are doing a lot of work. Pam said she would listen to the broadcast and share with Danielle what she hears. Perhaps the station would be interested in talking to a Basin Planner.

LAMOILLE BASIN PLAN SURVEY

Pam shared the results of the Lamoille Basin Plan Survey. One interesting find is that many people did not know about Basin Planning and that about half have property adjacent to surface waters. Pam will email the survey to the CWAC.
