 The Union Elementary School Playground Project, developed by the Montpelier Roxbury School District from plans developed by the SE Group with help from the students, parents and faculty of the school. The playground project not only created a newer and more inviting and interesting play space, but also corrected stormwater problems in the area and remediated unknown brownfield hazards.

## RFP's, Grant Information, Applications & Deadlines

#### **Municipal Roads Grants in Aid Program**

AOT invites municipalities to participate in the Municipal Roads, Grants-in-Aid Program, which provides funding for municipalities to implement best management practices (BMPs), including culvert replacements, ditching, stabilization, and more.

These Grants-in-Aid awards will total approximately \$3.1 million dollars in this grant cycle. Municipalities must return a signed letter by June 25, 2021 to be eligible.

#### **Economic Recovery Bridge Program**

The <u>application portal</u> for the Economic Recovery Bridge Program is live on the Agency of Commerce and Community Development (ACCD) <u>website</u>. The program is expected to deliver \$30 million in financial relief to 1) businesses who have not received state and federal funding due to eligibility constraints and 2) businesses who have continued to lose revenue due to COVID-19. The portal opened on **Monday, June 7th with applications reviewed first-come, first-serve.** Also available are the <u>slides and recording</u> from an informational webinar ACCD hosted on Friday, June 4th, where ACCD gave a program overview, discussed the application process, and answered questions.

The Economic Recovery Bridge Program is funded by \$10 million from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds allocated in H.315 (Act 9), the mini COVID relief bill, and \$20 million from the FY2022 budget. Thank you to the Vermont legislature and the Scott Administration for recognizing the need that still exists for many Vermont businesses! If your business has suffered a loss due to COVID-19, we encourage you to visit the ACCD website to learn more about the Economic Recovery Bridge Program and other supports available ability and resilience of local or regional food economies. **The deadline to apply is July 6th.**
