Managing EAB Infested Ash: A One-Day Workshop for Municipal Staff and Arborists

This workshop is a single day event offered at two locations:

- September 8th, 8am 3pm. Essex, VT. Register here.
- September 9th, 8am 3pm. Montpelier, VT. Registerhere

Who Should Attend? The event is free but requires registration. Municipal staff, parks employees, and others actively managing trees will be given priority; remaining space will be allocated to other municipal land managers or decision makers interested in learning more about the costs and effects of emerald ash borer on publicly managed ash trees.

Objectives: The workshop will include a morning indoor discussion about ash tree identification, signs and symptoms of emerald ash borer, and the current status of EAB in Vermont. Outdoors, the group will:

- learn how to assess and plan for removal ash trees that are visibly infested or suspected to be infested with EAB, including establishment of escape routes and communication channels;
- review safety standards, best practices, and considerations for both ground crews and chainsaw operators; and
- assess individual trees on site and discuss best removal methods, including felling from the ground, hiring a climbing crew, or utilizing a bucket truck or crane for tree removal.

Make Your Property Storm Smart: Free Assessments

Summer rain storms may be great for our gardens, but all that water can create challenges for streams and lakes in the Winooski Watershed. That's why the Friends of the Mad River, Friends of the Winooski River and Winooski Natural Resources Conservation District teamed up to offer free stormwater assessments to help you identify opportunities to be a better watershed steward. Storm Smart is a free program where water quality professionals help you find ways to slow down, spread out, and sink in rainfall on your property.



When you sign up for a site assessment, one of the Winooski Watershed Partners will reach out to you to schedule a 1-2 hour-long visit. During the visit they will trace the path water takes through your property and provide individualized recommendations for Green Stormwater Infrastructure solutions. These recommendations can include everything from adding a rain barrel next to your porch, to installing water bars on a gravel driveway or changing your lawn maintenance routine to make it more stream-friendly.

American Rescue Plan Funding Opportunities

Last week, <u>EDA announced six programs</u> to equitably invest \$3 billion allocated under President Biden's American Rescue Plan. (<u>Click here to read the press release</u>)

The programs aim to assist communities in their efforts to build back better by accelerating the economic recovery from the coronavirus pandemic and building local economies that will be resilient to future economic shocks.

The six programs are:

- · Build Back Better Regional Challenge (\$1 billion)
- · Good Jobs Challenge (\$500 million)
- · Economic Adjustment Assistance (\$500 million)
- · Indigenous Communities (\$100 million)
- · Travel, Tourism and Outdoor Recreation (\$750 million)
- · Statewide Planning, Research and Networks (\$90 million)
