Every three years Efficiency Vermont creates a plan for rebates and services Vermont needs to help save money on energy, and lower greenhouse gas emissions in our state. This document is called the Demand Resources Plan (DRP), and it is overseen by the Public Utility Commission (PUC).

To develop this plan, we want to hear from you!

Efficiency Vermont is primarily funded by an Electric Efficiency Charge, and it supports programs that reduce Vermont's overall electric costs for all ratepayers. We do this through programs and services like:

- · Rebates and incentives on energy efficient products, technologies, or projects
- · Education, advice, and technical support
- · Training for contractors, retailers, and other trade organizations
- Engagement with supply chain partners (such as global manufacturers or national retailers) to ensure energy efficient products are sold in our state

RFPs, Grant Information, Applications, and Deadlines

Local Infrastructure Hub

The Local Infrastructure Hub is now offering technical assistance to help small and mid-sized towns access federal infrastructure dollars.

Submitting strong applications for federal infrastructure money can be challenging for small and mid-sized cities, towns, and villages. To assist underserved local governments with populations of approximately 150,000 or less, the Local Infrastructure Hub is offering a series of bootcamps. These bootcamps are designed to help small and mid-sized local governments take advantage of the grant opportunities available through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. There will be over 30 bootcamps offered, the first five include:

- Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (\$1 billion): Supports communities as they undertake hazard mitigation projects, reducing the risks they face from disasters and natural hazards.
- Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program (\$550 million): Supports communities to implement strategies to reduce fossil fuel emissions, reduce the total energy use of the eligible entities, improve energy efficiency in the transportation, building, and other appropriate sectors.
- Flood Mitigation Assistance Grants (\$3.5 billion): Supports communities with projects that reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damage to buildings insured by the National Flood Insurance Program.
- Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation (SMART) Grant Program (\$500 million): Supports communities on demonstration projects focused on advanced smart community technologies and systems in order to improve transportation efficiency and safety.
- Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Grants (\$2.5 billion): Supports communities to address EV charging needs for passenger vehicles and light duty trucks.

VCRD's Climate Catalysts Innovation Fund

The <u>Vermont Council on Rural Development</u> (VCRD) announces the opening of applications for the second competitive round of the <u>Climate Catalysts Innovation Fund</u>. This fund support local champions to move Vermont closer to its climate and energy goals by providing at least \$20,000 in grant funding toward local projects.

- Award amounts range from \$500 \$4,000.
- \cdot Eligible applicants are municipalities, town committees, schools, businesses, and non-profit organizations.
- Applications will remain open until September 18th.
