Citizen Advisory Committees (CACs) - New York, Quebec, and Vermont

Independent committees comprised of citizens representing the public, environmental groups, agriculture, business and industry, sports and recreation, and local governments. The CACs advise the Steering Committee and the public about lake Issues and priorities of importance to the public.

Education and Outreach **Advisory Committee** (E&O AC)

Advises the Steering Committee. Comprised of professionals knowledgeable in the fields of education, planning, communication and outreach pertaining to environmental stewardship.

Heritage Area Program Advisory Committee (HAPAC)

Advises the Steering Committee. Comprised of professionals knowledgeable in the fields of regional history and interpretation, archeology, cultural heritage, conservation, sustainable agriculture, outdoor recreation and tourism.

Technical **Advisory Committee** (TAC)

Advises the Steering Committee. Comprised of technical experts and researchers from academia. natural resource management, agencies and other sectors as appropriate.



Since 1992, the Lake Champlain Basin Program has awarded more than \$8 million in local grants and funded more than eighty important research and demonstration projects about the Champlain Basin.

Vermont Citizens Advisory Committee (VTCAC)

- 14-member committee (10 community members + 4 legislatures)
- Amplifies community voices in the management of the Lake Champlain Basin
- Serves as a forum for citizens, interest groups, and local government to discuss Lake issues
- Creates and presents annual action plan to the Governor and legislative committees
- Holds monthly public meetings, next meeting is on May 15th from 5 – 7pm via Zoom
















Champlain Basin Education Initiative


The Champlain Basin Education Initiative (CBEI) is a consortium of environmental and place-based education groups throughout the Lake Champlain Basin. CBEI holds workshops on teaching about the Lake Champlain Basin for K-12 educators, and interested citizens. The workshops feature diverse and exciting presentations by local experts on topics such as climate change, water quality,



cultural heritage, and natural resources. CBEI is dedicated to offering rich learning opportunities to teachers so that they might be better qualified to offer them to their students.

Since 1992, more than 650 educators have participated in CBEI workshops and forums.
