Barre City Infill Study: Christian Meyer and Eli Toohey provided details about the Barre City Infill Analysis. Barre City staff and the Barre City Housing Task Force asked CVRPC to look at near- and long-term flood recovery alternatives for housing in the city. Christian noted that this type of data gathering and analysis could also be done for other municipalities and that we will be doing a similar study for Waterbury in the near future.

Discussion ensued related to potential for conversion of large old houses into multi-family, the impact of increased wastewater on the Lake Champlain basin, and the impact of increased development on ancillary services such as fire, police, schools, etc. It was reiterated that Act 250 is important for reviewing impacts as it relates to development.

Flood Recovery Update and Funding Programs: Keith Cubbon provided an update on the response to last year's flood event. It was noted that there is currently \$90,000,000 in FEMA funding available; and this in addition to State match creates an unprecedented opportunity for mitigation projects to take place over the next three to five years. The application deadline for these funds is August 20, 2024. Please contact Keith at CVRPC if your municipality has ideas for mitigation projects to leverage this funding as we are able to assist with the application process. It was reiterated that this is an all hazards grant and can be used for a multitude of mitigation projects, not just flood mitigation.
