

CVRPC Open Meeting Law Complaint Form

Vermont's Open Meeting Law requires the Central Vermont Regional Planning Commission (CVRPC), as a political subdivision of the State of Vermont, to post a complaint form on its website by which people can notify CVRPC of concerns or complaints regarding CVRPC's compliance with Vermont open meeting law requirements and the remedy they request CVRPC undertake. CVRPC intends that this form, and the accompanying information on its website (centralvtplanning.org/open-meeting-law) will satisfy those requirements by providing the public with a place and process to express their complaints. CVRPC will endeavor to respond to all complaints publicly within 10 days of receipt.



DESCRIPTION OF COMPLAINT

Date and Time Occurred:

Prior to bringing a civil action in the Civil Division of the Superior Court in the county in which the alleged violation has taken place for appropriate injunctive relief or for a declaratory judgment, Vermont law requires any person aggrieved by an alleged violation of the Open Meeting Law to provide the public body with a written notice that alleges a specific violation and requests a specific cure of such violation.
