#### 4 Approval of September 2024 TAC Meeting Minutes

#### **Presentation and Discussion: Transportation Land Use Interactions**

- Reuben presented a draft presentation on Transportation and Land Use for feedback from the TAC, the intended use of which is to ensure
- Bob A: Revisited slide on "Cycle of Automobile Dependency". Asked about London car ban (Ultra Low Emission Zone scheme).
- Joyce M: Asked about parking fee recommendations. Lower them?
  - o Reuben: Raise them (in conjunction with parking management).
  - o Joyce: Won't that discourage people from visiting town centers.
  - Reuben: Pricing appropriateness location dependent. Metering public parking to give users price signal and increase parking turn over in commercial areas.
- Mike H: Appreciated presentation. Thought it could use more simplification be made more accessible. More explanation of regional typologies merited.
- Lee CC: Felt it would benefit from better explanation of dependencies/synergies between potential interventions. Need for coordination of interventions.
- David E: Equity concerns with parking pricing. Questioned wide shoulders as a speeding factor, cited shoulder widening and striping case study that reduced lane width.
  - Reuben: Lane narrowing will reduce speed even if shoulder widens as a result.
     Striping acts as visual cue for drivers, impression that something is there.
  - David E: VTrans requirement that Town take over road (Class 1 Town Highway) if they want to drop speed below 30 MPH or do traffic calming. VTrans ban on shade trees in shoulder green strips between cartway and sidewalks.
  - Mike H: Tree ban likely due to trucks (branch maintenance concerns). VTrans 11 foot lane minimum: unsure if safer than 12 foot, concern about faster paint wear.
  - o David E: Paint cheaper than other options.
  - Mike H: Also federally eligible activity.
- o David E: Asked about rumbles on fog lines.

1	0	Mike H: Rumbles work well on centerline, dangerous for cyclists on fog lines
2		(only used on interstate).

- David E: Appreciated presentation. Would welcome return to more presentations in future.
- Bob A: Plainfield got MERP grant including 5 new municipal EV chargers. Was unable to connect with Road Foreperson to get bridge priorities.
