A motion was made to accept the February minutes by Stefan Pratt and was 2nd by Liz Scharf. The motion was voted on and passed unanimously.

Presenter: Karen Kurrle, Washington County Mental Health

Karen spoke about mental health and how to prepare and care for yourself before, during and after an event. Also spoke about how our families didn't sign on for our jobs and how to handle. Preplanning before a disaster importance for how we handle ourselves during a disaster. Spoke of being overwhelmed and of how Post traumatic stress and outbursts are normal responses. Also mentioned how to work through this with healthy coping strategies.

Karen provided the number for people to call and distribute for WCMHS services is 802-229-0591. The crisis screeners can always take a call from an Emergency Management Director and then figure out where to 'distribute it.' This is a 24/7 response number.

Roundtable-Flood updates

Keith gave a quick update on Plainfield and how they are dividing work with 6 positions and their attempt to develop a new section of village out of the floodplain.

Stefan Pratt spoke of sharing responses with neighboring towns due ability to respond and how to respond if they don't notify the town. That EMD's may shift coverage areas due to ability to respond due to location. Liz Scharf spoke of their community forum to discuss road management with experts to discuss their infrastructure publicly. Had sign ups for emergency management and long-term recovery groups. That we are all doing the same thing but alone and that would like to see a more regional response.

Stefan spoke of mutual aid agreement and the possibility of collective purchasing. Keith mentioned the status of this and need for commissioners to adopt.

Discussed a regional response or shared resources for response.

Keith spoke to VEM bringing a ICS-402 training to Plainfield to get the town staff and selectboard trained on how FEMA response will look and roles required.

Fred Messer spoke about the need for 211 data in an expedited format that can more easily be reached by EMD's. This current situation is horrible. Town's are supposed to be requesting residents to promote 211 but then can't access the data themselves to respond and check on their needs. Should be able to access the list daily not a week later. If this isn't going to be shared then it is worthless to the town for collection from the town perspective. Significant discussion on this and need to be able to access in real time. This needs to be in real time since this is an essential need.
