

Central Vermont Regional Emergency Management Committee Meeting Summary

May 14, 2025

Welcome and Introductions

There was not a quorum present at the beginning of the meeting, so we did not officially open the meeting.

Do to there no officers of the group being present at the start of the meeting. Keith gave an update on changes seen to FEMA. Update will be included at end of minutes.

Presenter: Devin Healy, Wildland Fire Specialist, Dept. of Forests, Parks, and Recreation

Presented on capabilities of the department. Access any resources through VEM watch officer. Must start process through them. Offer Wildland Fire Education training- trained 460 students in 2024. Fire prevention and education, they administer the Town Fire Warden's, outreach on fire danger, and provide the fire danger forecasts. Fire equipment purchasing program 50/50 for PPE and equipment for towns under 10,000 residents, provided to 31 towns in 2024. Work with prescribed burns on state lands and the Green Mountain National Forest. Not initial attack, provide expertise, can provide specialized equipment, wildland firefighters, Incident Management Team, Line Supervisors, 3 Wildland Fire Response Vehicles and 4 extended attack trailers. Have mutual aid agreements with other States, Provinces, and Organizations so can expand capabilities. Also, the avenue if you need aerial resources for fire suppression. 2024 saw an 18x increase in October and November than the 25-year average. Advocated for community wide protection planning to allow for wildland fire grants for equipment. Regional grant writing for equipment would be ideal and easiest to support.
