 14 A. Peal called the meeting to order at 4:03 pm.

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 16 **Adjustments to the Agenda**

17 No adjustments to the agenda.

18  
 19 **Public Comment**

20 No public comment.

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 22 **Approval of Minutes**

23 D. Greason moved to approve the 1/6/26 minutes. B. Butler seconded. The motion  
 24 carried unanimously.

25  
 26 **Regional Plan Schedule**

27 Staff provided an update on the timeline for completing the Regional Plan. The  
 28 review process typically takes about six months once the Plan is submitted to the  
 29 Land Use Review Board (LURB), after CVRPC completes its own several-month  
 30 public hearing process.

31  
 32 There are two potential paths:

- 33 • **Amendment Path:** Amend the 2024-readopted 2016 plan to add the Future  
 34 Land Use Map and housing targets required by December 31 under Act 181,  
 35 with limited chapter updates. This faster approach does not restart the 8-  
 36 year plan cycle.
- 37 • **Adoption Path:** Complete and adopt the fully updated Regional Plan begun  
 38 in 2019. This would restart the 8-year plan cycle and require more time to

1 finish.

2  
3 Staff explained that Act 181 requires regional planning commissions to adopt a  
4 Future Land Use Map by December 31, 2026. Failing to meet the statutory  
5 deadline could jeopardize state designation benefits and incentives for all  
6 municipalities in the region. Amendment revisions would focus on a statutorily  
7 compliant energy, housing, and future land use. Staff stated that the pre-  
8 submission date of mid-May was volunteered, and could potentially be pushed to  
9 June. The committee reached general agreement that staff will prepare a limited  
10 amendment to the 2016 Regional Plan to incorporate the FLUA map and housing  
11 targets required by Act 181, explore whether an extension from LURB is possible,  
12 and continue development of the full Regional Plan update in parallel. No formal  
13 vote was taken as the item was not warned as an action item.

#### 14 15 **Meeting Attendance**

16 A. Peal shared her concern that the last two scheduled meetings have not had a  
17 quorum, and stated the importance of attendance given the tight timeframe for  
18 submission of the new Regional Plan. After discussion, it was decided that  
19 meetings will remain on the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday at 4:00.

#### 20 21 **Utilities, Facilities, and Services Chapter – Goals, Strategies, and Policies**

22 D. Greason and A. Peal's comments on the chapter will be incorporated into the  
23 draft. The equity and technical assistance framework will move to the introduction  
24 or overview chapter, with chapter-specific items where appropriate.

#### 25 26 **Future Land Use Updates**

27 B. Voigt shared the current draft of downtown Waterbury's FLU areas. It was noted  
28 that the state's chosen color palette presents accessibility limitations. Staff shared  
29 drafts of progress with Waterbury's Planning Commission.

30  
31 Waterbury and Barre Town may pursue Tier 1B status. Montpelier and Barre City  
32 may pursue 1A.
